The Parish Council's comments from the previous planning application, Ribble Valley Remembrance Garden – Variation of conditions 3/2018/0640 are still relevant and are quoted below; The Parish Council objects to the Variation of Conditions. It has been established that, subsequent to the granting of planning permission in 2015, the Remembrance Park is on consecrated ground. The Bishop of Blackburn has specifically instructed that the application to deconsecrate a section of the Remembrance Park be withdrawn. A legal process needs to be followed. This will involve the Blackburn Diocese, the Consistory Court and the Ministry of Justice but until the Developer addresses this problem the Parish Council recommends no further development takes place on
