## 5. Planning Application 3/2019/0448

Whalley Parish Council strongly objected to the Planning application and the recent removal of Lancashire County Council's Highway Objection. The Borough Councillors added that an Appeal will be defended against the development by Ribble Valley Borough Council. The Borough Council will seek costs against Lancashire County Council if the development goes through. A letter was sent to David Bloomer from Whalley Parish Council in November 2019 pointing out that no account had been made of the future high volume of traffic at the roundabout in question, resulting from the considerable new housing builds which had already passed the planning stage. No reply had been received from LCC Officer. Councillor Berryman reiterated his frustration and the fact that although consideration was given to Northbound traffic from the Highway Authority none was given to Southbound traffic that he believed was significant.
